The region has a rich variety of scenery encompassing open stretches of meadow, dense forests, snow-capped mountains and perennial rivers most notably the Yamuna and the Ganga, the two holy rivers of Indian mythology. This region has traditionally been a popular retreat since the establishment of a number of hill stations by the British in the nineteenth century for people escaping the heat of the Indian plains.
